Locally, you will have the chance to elect 3 ward councillors based on the new boundaries. You will also have the chance to vote for the newly created North East Mayor as well as a new Police and Crime Commissioner.

Operation Coastwatch set to return



A summer initiative which has seen antisocial behaviour fall to a 10-year low along the North Tyneside coast is set to return soon.

The operation aims to reassure the community and take swift action to prevent disorderly incidents during spells of warm weather.

As in previous years, Operation Coastwatch includes extra foot patrols, preventative work at Metros to disrupt and stop any disorder before it reaches communities, and beach wardens to monitor coastal activity.

Council staff patrol the beaches to monitor against litter and antisocial behaviour and the Community and Public Space Protection Team will work alongside Northumbria Police colleagues to provide reassurance to local people.

The £5000 will help support Woodlawn School to purchase a wheelchair accessible minibus for students.






The Carer's Leave Act 2023 came into force on Saturday 6 April 2024, giving people who provide care to a family member, friend or relative the right to up to five days of unpaid leave from work to fulfil their caring responsibilities.

I was proud to support this legislation in Parliament and I am delighted that nearly 5000 unpaid carers in Tynemouth constituency will now have access to these new workplace rights.

Cost of Living Debt Research

The Financial Conduct Authority has recently published research which shows in the 12 months to January 2024, 2.7m adults sought help from a lender, a debt adviser or other financial support charity because they found themselves in financial difficulty. Nearly half (47%) of those that sought help said they were in a better position as a result. However, 2 in 5 adults who had fallen behind on their bills said they had avoided talking to their lender about their finances.

Renters, single adults with children, adults from a minority ethnic background and people living in the north-east of England were more likely to be in financial difficulty.

The FCA are advising people:

- Contact your lender for support if you're worried about keeping up with payments. Talking to your lender about your options won't impact your credit score.
